Ford & Yarbrough Congratulate Local Illinois State Scholars

CHICAGO, **IL** – State Reps. La Shawn K. Ford (D-Chicago) and Karen Yarbrough (D-Maywood) on Friday announced that 124 local high school students from their districts have been selected by the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) as 2010-2011 Illinois State Scholars.

"These State Scholars will be the future leaders of our community, and I think it is great that we are able to recognize them in this way," Ford said. "It is important that we continue to encourage them as they leave high school and enter college and adulthood."

"Our local Illinois State Scholars have worked hard and we as a community are so proud of the example they are setting," Yarbrough said. "Hopefully this is just another milestone in their lives as they head to college and a lifetime of learning."

According to ISAC, winners chosen as Illinois State Scholars must rank in the top 10 percent of the state's high school seniors from the 711 high schools in all 102 counties. Selection is based on SAT, ACT and/or Prairie State Achievement Exam scores, and/or class rank at the end of the junior year. Input from the schools' guidance counselors is also used to help determine the winners. Students will receive congratulatory letters from ISAC and certificates of achievement. At least a half million Illinois State Scholars have been recognized in the past 50 years, including 17,335 this year.

"Excellent high school grades are tremendously important for laying the groundwork for future college success. Illinois State Scholars are the best and the brightest in our state's high schools, and we salute them, their families and their teachers on this achievement," said ISAC executive director Andrew Davis. Davis also counseled State Scholars and their classmates: "Find the right fit to give yourself the best chance at college success. While the prestigious recognition does not include a monetary award, designees are encouraged to cite the award on applications for college admission and scholarships in addition to completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) after January 1 to determine eligibility for federal and state aid, including Illinois's \$400 million need-based Monetary Award Program (MAP).
