



Behavioral and Social Genomics of Aging: Opportunities in the Health and Retirement Study (CFDA No. 93.866)

Purpose: To advance our understanding of how genetic, behavioral, and psychosocial factors affect the health and well being of older Americans.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, or special district governments; independent school districts; public, private, and state controlled institutions of higher education; public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities; Native American tribal organizations; nonprofits; for profit organizations other than small businesses; and small businesses.

Digital Humanities Implementation Grants (CFDA No. 45.169)

Purpose: To fund the implementation of innovative digital-humanities projects that have successfully completed a start-up phase and demonstrated their value to the field; to enhance our understanding of central problems in the humanities; to raise new questions in the humanities; or to develop new digital applications and approaches for use in the humanities.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, or special district governments; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; Native American tribal organizations; and nonprofits.

Funding: \$325,000.

Economic Research on Incentives for Efficient Use of Preventive Services (CFDA No. 93.310)

Purpose: To advance general knowledge about how incentives can be structured to improve both health and cost outcomes through more efficient use of preventive services; it is not primarily to advance specific knowledge about any particular preventive intervention or prevention of any particular health condition.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, or special district governments; independent school districts; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities; Native American tribal organizations; nonprofits; for profit organizations other than small businesses; and small businesses.

Funding: \$1.6 million.

Technical Assistance and Dissemination to Improve Services and Results for Children With Disabilities—Model Demonstration Projects for English Learners With or At Risk of Having a Disability (CFDA No. 84.326M)

Purpose: To promote academic achievement and to improve results for children with disabilities by providing technical assistance, supporting model demonstration projects, disseminating useful information, and implementing activities that are supported by scientifically based research.

Eligibility: Local educational agencies (LEAs), including public charter schools that are considered LEAs under state law; IHEs; other public agencies; private nonprofit organizations; outlying areas; freely associated states; Indian tribes or tribal organizations; and for-profit organizations.

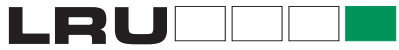
